Purpose: This document provides a Missouri-specific, legally safe pathway for parents, caregivers, and guardians to verify whether public benefits or services were billed, paid, or claimed using their own identity or that of a dependent, and outlines official steps to take when discrepancies are identified.

Introduction

Social media and news reporting sometimes describe situations where services appear to have been billed, reimbursed, or publicly funded in a person's name—or a child's name—without the individual's knowledge or consent. In Missouri, there is **no single public "name search" clearinghouse** that aggregates every program's payments or claims.

Records are maintained by the administering agencies under state and federal confidentiality rules. The practical solution is **self-verification**: review official records you are entitled to as a parent/guardian, then use official complaint and fraud channels if you find a discrepancy.

Section 1 — Licensed / Regulated Child Care Verification (Missouri DESE)

Missouri’s regulated child care oversight and public provider information are published through the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE), Office of Childhood.

Section 2 – Child Care Subsidy (Payments on Behalf of Families) (Missouri DESE)

Missouri’s Child Care Subsidy Program assists eligible parents/guardians with payments for child care, and DESE provides official family-facing program information and contact pathways. [3][4]

2.3 What parents/guardians should review

- **Authorization/eligibility notices** (provider name, approved dates, and any family copayment).
- **Provider identity** using the official Child Care Search tool (Section 1.2). [2]
- **Dates of care/attendance** compared to what you believe occurred.
- **Any provider changes** reflected in notices or portal communications (retain copies).

Section 3 — Health Coverage Claims (MO HealthNet / Medicaid) and Fraud Reporting

Health services billed under Missouri Medicaid (MO HealthNet) generate formal claims records through plan and program systems. These records are the primary source for verifying whether services were billed in your name or your child's name.

3.3 What to check

- Dates of service (were you/your child present?).
- Provider names and locations you recognize (or do not recognize).
- Claims continuing after coverage/provider changes.

Section 4 — Public Records Requests (Missouri Sunshine Law, Chapter 610)

Missouri public records access is governed by the Missouri Sunshine Law (Chapter 610, RSMo). Records involving minors and health/benefit cases may be exempt or not publicly releasable; however, you can request records you are legally entitled to as a parent/guardian and request a written explanation of any exemptions applied.

4.3 Practical request structure (recommended)

1. Identify yourself as the parent/guardian and list the dependent(s) involved.
2. Specify the program (child care subsidy, MO HealthNet, etc.), provider name(s), and date range.
3. Request “records sufficient to show” payments/claims made on behalf of your dependent for that period.
4. Ask for a written explanation of any confidentiality limitations or exemptions applied.

Section 5 — Reporting Suspected Fraud (Missouri Official Channels)

Preserve documentation first (letters, notices, provider names/addresses, dates, screenshots, attendance records). Then use official reporting channels.

Section 6 — Public “Red Flag” Patterns (For Awareness Only)

The following markers do not prove misconduct, but they can help families know when to verify records or request clarification:

- **Date mismatch:** claims/payments on days the child was not in care or not receiving the service.
- **Provider mismatch:** provider listed that the family never used.
- **Duration mismatch:** billing continues after termination/withdrawal.
- **Authorization mismatch:** billed hours exceed authorized hours.
- **Identity mismatch:** communications/records referencing a child/dependent you do not recognize.
